

How many people are currently receiving BSS – National Picture?




National totals




Southern region
While the Lifelinks referrals have been disproportionally high in terms of the national statistics, the referrals are now nearly as one would expect proportionally to the general population.

High proportion of children referred at the age of 8 years the CDS appears to be a very high referrer, reflects the different approaches of CDS nationally.

Explore are starting to look at allocating as a central resource now that referral timeframes are starting to come align within region.




Northern Region

Explore are really pleased with the reduction in the Taikura region, this was one of the country's most significant waitlists which has now reached less than 8 months with no priority 1 on the waitlist
