## Research rationale

- Disabled refugees are *invisible* to disability services and to the rest of society compounding an already difficult resettlement experience
- Stories from families that have navigated disability services:
  - a unique source of meaningful help that we can provide
  - have the potential to increase disabled refugees' chances of contributing meaningfully to their new society
- Analysed interviews from disabled refugees and their families to identify the core elements to successful settlement
- Audience:
  - Disabled refugees and families
  - Professionals involved in their experience


